As we reflect back over this past dancing season we must take stock as to the health of our great activity. In your club were the classes as large as you would like? Did you and your club do all they could do to recruit new students (new friends)? Did you actively support the new dancers so

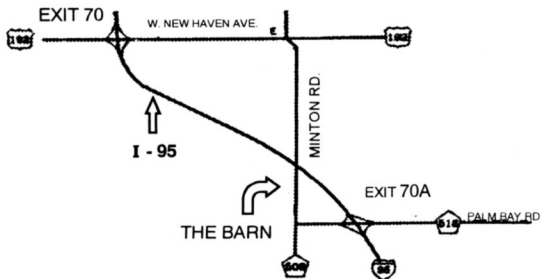
they could immediately enjoy the activity? Believe it or not, now is the time to start building for the classes that will be held this fall and winter. As Linda and I travel the clubs in South Brevard and Indian River County as area representatives for the Central Florida Association, we notice that the crowds are way down. Now is the time to do something about it. Now, if I knew what we should do, I'd already be doing it and we wouldn't have this discussion. What we need is a team effort to: 1). define the problem, 2). brainstorm the problem, 3). come up with a plan and 4). work the plan as a team. Of course, if we had lots of money we could take full page advertisements in the local papers and get lots of new dancers. At over \$5000.00 per page, that is not an option for us. There is a lot of media coverage we can get free. All the local radio stations will run announcements on classes, picnics and open house events. Newspapers will also do the same. The important thing in any advertisement is to keep the message before the intended audience.

Have we even selected our audience? What age group are dancers most likely to come from? Many say it is the group that have raised their children. Some say it is the retired group. Others voice the opinion that we have too much competition from television and the "Blockbusters" rentals. I do not hear that those who golf have that problem. For every person that square dances, there are at least 15 that golf! It is not the cost of our activity as other forms of exercise and entertainment cost much more. We try to be friendly to all newcomers so that is not the problem.

What do we need to do? If you have a suggestion we would love to hear it. We will take all suggestions and present them to the Central Florida Association and to the Presidents Council of Brevard County. We will not use your name if that is your desire and we will list the suggestions in the July issue of THE BARN OWL. Now is the time to take action. Now is the time to get a really large and excited group of new dancers into your club for the fall/winter classes. If we take action, good things will happen. If we do nothing we can expect that nothing will happen. What happens is up to you. Will you take the time to consider the problem and bring to bear your energy on the problem so we may have a great class in your club this fall/winter?

SMOOTH DANCING

This month we thought we would take a look at how we dance and how we can make our dancing smoother. First a description of what smooth dancing is. The CALLERLAB Choreographic Guidelines has the following definition.

"DANCE ACTION WHICH ALLOWS THE DANCERS TO MOVE COMFORTABLY, WITHOUT ABRUPT CHANGES OF DIRECTION OR EXCESSIVE STOPS, WITH STEPS THAT MATCH THE BEAT OF THE MUSIC".

From this definition it appears that smooth dancing depends a great deal on the caller and his/her ability to call in a way that will allow the action to be smooth. We believe that the caller has a major role in providing a smooth dance experience. It is

true that if the caller is not using proper timing, the dancing can be "stop and go" which is certainly NOT smooth. We also believe that each dancer can contribute significantly to the feeling of smooth dancing. The dancer's role is "dance to the music". That is, take one step for each beat of the music and not to rush through the calls.

There are many factors contributing to the feeling of smoothness. One major contributor is the experience level of the dancers. An experienced dancer who is very familiar with the material will, in most cases, be able to react to the calls in a smoother manner than will an inexperienced dancer. In other words, the more we dance the smoother our dancing will be. That is why dancing with other callers and dancers is so important. The experience of dancing with others will help increase the smoothness of our dancing.

Each dancer in a square is dependent on the other seven to help provide a smooth dancing experience. One way to do this is to listen to the caller and be ready to react to the calls. Another way is to NOT push and shove others in the square. We have written before about helping in a square. This can be done most effectively by pointing where the other dancers should be. Each dancer is also responsible for his/her part of the feeling of smoothness. This includes listening to the caller, reacting to the calls, and of course, knowing the moves. A prime factor which contributes to smoothness is the concentration level of each dancer. If we are thinking of something else we can not put our full attention to the dancing and this will contribute to a decline in smoothness.

Another factor which can detract from smoothness is one which we had not thought of until an experienced and very good dancer mentioned it. This factor is the jewelry we wear! What's THAT??? What we are saying here is that sometimes we wear jewelry with very sharp edges and "dangly things" which can snag on clothes or worse yet actually cause injury to someone else. Our advise is to not wear large or "dangly" type jewelry which can get caught or injure others.

We believe that smooth dancing is more enjoyable than non-smooth dancing. We also believe that smooth dancing is not only possible, it is something we should strive for in most of the dancing we do. We think the caller has the major role in providing a smooth dance experience and that the dancers can contribute significantly to the smoothness of the dancing. When we call we try to provide proper timing and smooth flowing material most of the time. We believe dancers deserve no less than a comfortable dance experience with just the right amount of challenge.

Let us know your thoughts!! Bye for now and see ya' in a square!!!

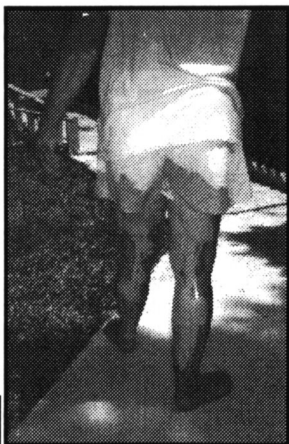
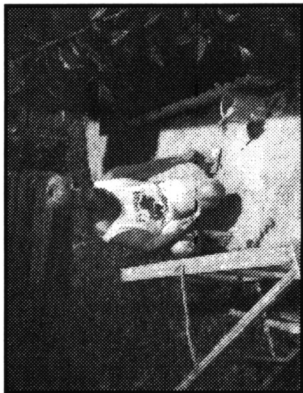
Well after she scooped as much paint off her body as possible and some off the sidewalk, back up the ladder she went and she tried to continue painting. I
