

For over 20 years it has been known that heart surgery does not cure heart disease. A study, called Coronary Artery Surgery Study (CASS), showed that there is virtually no difference in survival rates between patients who had surgery and those who were treated with medicine only. In fact, people who have had bypass surgery experience more rapid progression of atherosclerosis. Bypass surgery has been shown to reduce the formation of collateral circulation, the spontaneous growth of blood vessels which naturally "bypass" clogged arteries.

If you have had a bypass and you do have a heart attack, you're likely to fare worse than someone who has not had bypass before a heart attack. Therefore, it is even more important for those of us who have had bypass surgery to take charge of our own health!

- 2. Take supplements of omega-3 fatty acids to reduce the risk of clot formations.






