

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

HAPPY

The word "happy" is used 25 times and "happier" is used 1 time in the whole Bible. The word "happy" has 2 meanings in the Old Testament. The first is "to be straight", to "guide or lead", and to "be honest". The second meaning is to "be secure", "successful" and to "prosper".

In the New Testament it can also mean "fortunate" or "well off". The word "happier" has the same meaning and is used only once in the New Testament.

What does it take to make a person "happy"? Most often we think a person is happy if he or she is rich. We think of health when we think of a person being "happy".

In First Kings, chapter 10, verse 8, we see that people that are in the presence of wisdom are happy. "Happy are thy men, happy are these thy servants, which stand continually before thee, and that hear thy wisdom".

Proverbs 3: 13 states "Happy is the man that findeth wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding".

Proverbs 14: 21: "He that dispiseth his neighbor sinneth; but he that hath mercy on the poor, happy is he".

Job 5: 17: "Behold, happy is the man that God correcteth; therefore despise not the chastening of the Almighty".

In the book of Job we see Job, the richest man on the earth, losing everything he has; wealth, possessions, sons, daughters and all material things. He then losses his health and writes "happy is the man that God correcteth".

The first time the word is used in the Bible is in Genesis and follows the birth of a baby.

Happiness, or the state of being happy, is not due to the lack of, or abundance of money. It is not even the state of ones health that makes us happy. Job had lost his health, yet he said he was happy. King David was very wealthy and the ruler of a great nation, yet he talked of his unhappiness.

Happy is the person that findeth wisdom! Happy is the person that helps those in need. Happy is the person that feareth the Lord. Happiness is a state or position rather than wealth or health. We have all known people that are wealthy but not happy. We have all known people in great health but not

happy. We have all known people sick and poor that were a constant source of strength. We have lived with those who are in constant pain yet bring joy to all they touch. We have all seen the articles on winners of the lottery showing a life that was worse after the winnings than before. Wealth doesn't make happiness. It cannot buy happiness. Happiness comes from doing rather than getting. It is what we do for people that not only makes us happy, but makes those around us happy. Proverbs 16: 20: "and whoso trusteth the Lord, happy is he." HOW TO THANK THE CALLER

You think your club has the best caller in the area. His/her choreography is interesting. He/ she is fun and comfortable to dance to, always patient, and good natured. You wish to show your appreciation, but don't know how.

It's 9:00 PM and there are six squares prancing on the floor. By 9:30 PM only two squares remain. The caller looks about and thinks "What am I doing wrong? Why do so many dancers leave early?" The dance still has another tip to go. By the last tip only three couples remain, and they're the cleanup crew. So the dance ends early.

On the way home, the caller wonders what he/she can do to make the dance more exciting. Do the dancers want more challenge? Or less challenge? Different singing calls? Or maybe he/she is wearing them down. Are the

tips too long? Too short? These and a lot of other things go through his/her head on the way home.

What this caller was experiencing was "dancer runout" (no relation to "dancer burnout") disease. That's the premature outflow of dancers that manifests itself in four groups; (1) those eager to follow the primeval urge to "beat the traffic", (2) those who party with friends somewhere else. (3) those who have to get up early the next day, and (4) older members who run out of breath by the middle of the dance. Some clubs are afflicted more seriously than others. It appears to be contagious, affecting most of the regular members and leaving the guests to fend for themselves at the end of the evening. There is no known cure. For the first group, moving up the quitting time only results in them leaving still earlier, inspiring others to follow suit. A half hour before the end of the dance seems to be the madic number. What they do not seem to realize is they are affecting the performance and self confidence of the caller. If they wish to indicate they did not particularly enjoy the caller's performance, this is the way to do it. On the other hand, if they really wish to show appreciation to the caller, the very best way is to stay for the whole show.

Would you go to a play and leave before the last act? When you leave the dance early, you're cutting out the caller's last act. Most callers plan their programs to have a beginning, middle and end. The last tip is usually meant to be special. It may be a relaxer or a rouser, but always something the

caller thinks he does especially well. The old-time dancers can remember that twenty or so years ago the average dance lasted from 8 till 11 PM and most stayed to the end. Some callers can remember completing the last tip and having the dancers clapping for more. Attitudes seemed different then. I can remember it was customary for dancers to line up after one of these sessions and file past the caller, thanking him for the great time. What has changed? Have the callers changed, the dancers, or maybe square dancing itself?

You don't really have to line up like in the old days and thank him. You don't have to tell him what a great dance he called. All this means nothing if you walk out the door early. If you respect your caller, think he does a fine job, and wish to show your appreciation, stay and dance the last tip. Besides, it's good courtesy

Bye for now and see ya in a square!!!


than eat, meet us for the Thursday Breakfast. I know you will enjoy the fellowship.




