

Fun For All Jerry & Del Reed Rockledge, Florida

During the September 1998 meeting of the East Coast Callers Association (ECCA) there was a discussion of how we might help recruit more new dancers. All agreed this was a major issue and one which will bring more new dancers into square dancing. One of the things many people have been saying is that it takes too long to get new dancers into the activity. This issue has been discussed by dancer and caller groups for a long time now. One way to get people into the activity is to interest them in dancing and to show them that square dancing is NOT SQUARE and is not like they may remember it from their school days.

The approach the members of the ECCA have taken is to plan several "Community Dance" events. These events are intended to bring modern western square dancing to non-dancers. The first of these events is scheduled for Wednesday November 11, 1998 at The Barn. The idea is to provide a fun filled evening to introduce non-dancers to our activity. We plan to include square dancing, line dancing, contra, and mixers. Our primary purpose is to bring square dancing to new people. Our goal is to establish a continuing series of these dances.

We believe that if we can bring people and square dancing together in a positive light many will become interested and will continue to attend these "Community Dance" events. We are planning them so that people could attend occasionally and still have a good time and be "dancers". We also believe that at least some of these people will become interested in learning more and will join a class and eventually will join one of the clubs in this area.

We have made a commitment of talent, money, and time to this project and are now asking for the support of square dancers throughout the Space Coast area. Please think about attending these dances and bringing a friend. The advantage here is that they do not have to commit to any long

Today seemed normal except for the tension headache that Roy was unable to shake throughout the day. While in the yard, Roy fell to his knees and became unconscious. Roy's wife Karen ran to his side and told the oldest daughter to call for an ambulance.

The Rescue

Paramedics arrived and called for a Life Flight Helicopter to rush Roy to Hermann Hospital. The flight team had no response from Roy while in transit.

In one hour Roy's condition became critical. Roy had stopped breathing on his own and was placed on a respirator to completely support his breathing.

A CAT scan revealed that Roy was suffering from a tumor in his brain that was inoperable and had grown to encompass the pens, a structure of the brain that controls breathing and endocrine functions of the human body. Roy never spoke to Karen again. His body lay in the Intensive Care Unit, his heart beating, warm and lifelike.

Determination of Brain Death

Dr. David George, a neurologist in his second year of fellowship training with the University of Texas Health Science Center in the Texas Medical Center was called to evaluate Roy's condition.

A radio-isotope scan had revealed that Roy's brain function had ceased and he was pronounced brain dead, an irreversible consequence of his brain tumor.

Before informing the family, Dr. George called in Joe Sharp, a paramedic, and Organ Donor Coordinator with Life Gift, the regional organ procurement organization in Houston. After consulting with the Life Gift medical directors, Roy had been approved for potential organ donation.

The hardest decision of Karen's life was approaching fast.

Consent

Karen and Roy's three daughters, Elizabeth, Jennifer and Melissa, were called into a meeting with Dr. George and Joe Sharp. Emotions were running high as Karen had known what the doctors were there to say. Just a few hours earlier, Roy was a father of three girls and a loving husband to Karen.

Dr. George told Karen that Roy's condition was not curable and that Roy was brain dead. After a brief period of mourning, Life Gift coordinator Joe Sharp approached Roy's wife to ask if he and Karen had ever considered organ donation. Karen remembered Roy's intention to donate his organs and tissues if the need ever arose.

After a short discussion with the children, Karen felt that organ donation was the best way to continue Roy's spirit. Karen signed the paperwork and went to see Roy's body one last time before she left the Hospital.

Although Roy looked alive and warm, Karen knew then that she would never talk to Roy again.



Coordinator Takes Charge.

Rov's pertinent information was entered into the national waiting list as a donor of kidneys, heart, lungs, liver, pancreas, and small intestine. His blood type, weight and human leukocyte antigen factor, HLA, was taken into consideration along with the geographic location of the hospital where Rov's body was being cared for

From there, the United Network for Organ Sharing, (the governing body that holds the contract for placing and allocating organs for transplantation in the United States), computer database was cross matched with the blood type, weight, HLA, and location and produced a list of potential recipients for Roy's organs. From there, the donation coordinator managed Rov's heartbeat and blood pressure to keep his organs from deteriorating.

The list produced by UNOS distributed the organs as follows:

Heart Locally to a 45 year old man in Houston suffering from a weak heart

Lunas In Texas to a teenage boy suffering from cystic fibrosis Left Kidney

Locally to a 32 year old man suffering from end-stage renal disease. Pancreas and Right Kidney To a 14 year old girl suffering from type II diabetes. She is a 6 antigen

match, a near perfect recipient for this set of organs. To a patient in Nebraska afflicted with poor intestinal motility Small Intestine

Joe contacted all the regional organ procurement coordinators that in turn talked to their physicians and surgeons that oversee the care of the potential recipients. All the physicians accepted the condition of the donor. Coordinators from the cities planned for transportation to bring the potential recipients into the hospitals.

The Organ and Tissue Recovery

Upon arrival at the airport, ambulances took the organ recovery teams to Hermann Hospital where Roy's body was taken to surgery. During the entire process, Roy's body was handled with the dignity and care that any person undergoing surgery is afforded. He is draped and prepared for a standard surgical procedure.

Upon removal and preservation of the organs, the machines that had kept Roy's body alive were removed. Roy then progressed to biological death.

Tissue recovery teams picked up where the organ teams left off. Tissue Recovery Coordinators removed Roy's corneas for transplantation.

Skin and bone was recovered for transplantation into persons suffering from burns and orthopedic injuries.

These same procedures were undertaken the same as a standard surgical procedure.

Here at Thanksgiving time, what better way to share and to honor the season than to sign an ORGAN DONATION FORM. The Living Bank Account has been saving lives for 30 years. This is your chance to save a life. Linda and I have a friend that is alive today because someone had a heart to give him.

BAKED LEMON CHICKEN WITH LIGHT MUSHROOM SAUCE

4 boneless skinless chicken breasts

1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

2 lemons

3 cups chopped mushrooms

2 cans chicken broth 2 tbsp flour

1 tsp tarragon

parsley salt and freshly ground pepper

Coat chicken breasts with olive oil and squeeze the juice of one lemon over them. Season with salt and pepper and place 1 to 2 slices of lemon on each breast.

Bake in 350 degree oven for approximately 30-40 minutes or until juices run clear.

While chicken is baking, melt half a stick of butter in a medium skillet. Add 3 cups of chopped mushrooms and one teaspoon of tarragon. Lightly sauté until the mushrooms are tender and golden brown in color, about 6 minutes.

Stir flour completely into the mushroom mixture. Slowly add chicken broth and continue stirring, gradually increasing heat. Gently boil until mixture reduces to form a thick, creamy sauce. Approximately 10 minutes

Add juice from half a lemon into sauce.

Spoon sauce over breast and garnish with a sprig of parsley.




The Yellow Rockers are fortunate to have excellent leadership at all levels of their organization. The new officers slate is filling up nicely and a continuation of leadership is expected.

COMPUTERS

This month I want to look at the INTERNET. This is not a complete thesis on the Internet, it is basically information on getting on the Internet and downloading files and information to your computer.

There are many computer users that think you must be signed up for either AOL or MSN to use the Internet. This is not true and that belief can cost you extra dollars every month. All you have to do is select your own ISP (Internet Service Provider) and then use a BROWSER like NETSCAPE or INTERNET EXPLORER. Both the Internet Explorer from Microsoft and Netscape from Netscape are FREE. They do not cost you a dime to buy and they do not cost you a dime to use. The only cost you have from using the Internet is your ISP. America Online is also an ISP as well as a browser. I have found that AOL is easy to install, easy to use and very prone to say "goodbye" when you least want it to. It is also far more expensive than using a local ISP.

The only advantage to using MSN, AOL, Prodigy, or any national ISP is that you can connect via a local telephone line almost anywhere in the USA. With your local ISP, you can only connect from the local line. If you do a lot of travelling and want to use the internet, than you may want to opt for a national ISP. I only worry about E-Mail as I travel and I have the free national service from JUNO. JUNO is basically an E-Mail service. It now offers internet connections but again is more expensive than the local ISP you can connect with.

I use NET4U.NET out of Palm Bay and have had excellent results. Its rate of \$15.00 per month on a 6 month plan is very reasonable. It provides for unlimited usage and gives excellent mail service. The name of the owner there is Shrikant C. Raval and his number is 951-1800. He will also download to your system the NETSCAPE NAVIGATOR and instruct you on how to set up your system. There are many others around that I have heard excellent reports on. The Yellow Pages list many.

Here are some of the things you need to set up an Internet Account:

- 1 TIME You will spend a lot of time on the internet
- 2 MONEY You will need the ISP costs ~ 15 25 per month
- 3 USERNAME select a name that you can remember and is descriptive.
- 4 PASSWORD Select a password that only you know. DO NOT USE SS# or house number or anything someone could try.
- 5 BROWSER What browser you want to use. You can use more than one. They are free as of this date. I have used Podigy, AOL, IE4.0 and Netscape. The one I am currently using is Netscape. The trade publica-

I do use it on the notebook as it installs automatically with Windows 98. I did not want to use more of the hard drive for browsers so I use IE 4.0.

Now, once you are online you will surley want to download some of the great free stuff they have on the Internet. For example, the manufacturers of your hardware are constantly upgrading their drivers. You can down load these files and increase the capabilities of your system. Whatever your interest, there are thousands of articles you can download.

Downloading is very easy. The instructions you get from the WEB site are very clear. What is not clear is where your material you request will be stored on your hard drive. Windows 98 makes it very easy for you to tell the computer where to store information. There is also the FIND option from the START ICON that enables you to find any file on your hard drive. Here the problem is that you must know the name of the file you are looking for. Many times the file you are downloading is not a name you will remember. Once the file has completed its transfer to your computer, all information of the file name and where it was stored is gone from the screen.

You can easily remedy the storage location problem by creating a special folder to store all downloaded files. I have a folder on my removable hard drive that I call DOWNLOAD. I always direct incoming files to be stored there. It also gives me one more layer of protection from destructive files from the internet. When I select "SAVE TO DISK" on the download option from the internet, I tell it to save it to the DOWNLOAD folder and I give it a meaningful name. You do not have to, nor should you, accept the default options. Your drive is hugh and contains thousands of files and folders. You do not want to be looking for something on it. You also do not want to be downloading again when you can not find the desired file. It takes time and uses your drive space needlessly.

Normally the files you download are self extracting. That means that all you need to do is double click (single click if you have Windows 98 and have it set up as a WEB PAGE.). The received file will then execute and do the necessary functions. It may install a program or upgrade a file. It may also attach itself to a program. Normally it all happens automatically. An example of this is the AOL Instant Messenger that you can download from AOL. You do not need to be an AOL member to use the great service.

You can delete the downloaded file after you have used it to upgrade or to install a new option on your computer. Do not save files once they have been executed. You will have too many useless files on your hard drive.
