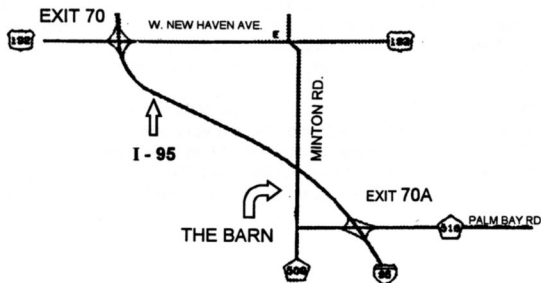

NATURAL ALTERNATIVES TO OVER THE COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

IMPORTANT: PLEASE READ

The information in this article is intended to increase your knowledge about natural remedies and by no means is intended to diagnose or treat an individual's health problems or ailments. The information given is not medical advice nor is it presented as a course of personalized treatment. There may be risks involved in connection with some of the natural remedies suggested in these articles, just as there may be risks involved in connection with prescription drugs. Therefore, before starting any type of natural remedy or medical treatment, or before discontinuing any course of medical treatment you may now be undergoing, you should consult your own health-care practitioner.

It seems every time I take my children to our doctor the outcome is always a quick prescription and in 10-15 days they are feeling better. I've heard that most illnesses remedy themselves in about a week and a half to two weeks 10-15 days).

Should I take more direct control of my health rather than heading for the doctor's office?

According to the May 20, 1998 issue of JAMA (Journal of American Medical Association), "...51% of approved drugs have serious side effects. Each year prescription drugs injure 1.5 million people so severely that they require hospitalization and 100,000 die, making prescription drugs a leading cause of death in the United States."

Any time drugs are used, it should be with caution. You will want to ask your doctor why he is prescribing the drug and whether there are non-drug options. Ask what the possible side effects of the drugs may be. Ask if your immune system will ward off the illness in roughly the same period of time. You may want to express concern that you've heard that many drugs compromise the immune system which may in fact extend the period of illness.

Doctors are not careless, but many respond to the expectations of their patients. When some patients who are unaware of the dangers, go to a doctor they have expectation of receiving a prescription or they feel like they haven't gotten their money's worth. When the cold bug hits, they aren't satisfied with: "Go home, drink 10-12 glasses of pure water each day, drink fresh vegetable juices, and be sure to get enough exercise and fresh air. Oh yes...get 10 hours of sleep to help your immune system. Keep it up for 15 days." The patient may feel like they could read that in a book, why do they need a doctor. But, you can't get a prescription in a book.

One of our members called in complaining that they were tired, achy, losing energy and had no appetite. After an interview, it was discovered he was given two prescriptions, which together are deadly. After calling the phar-

RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS

How can we get new members? How can our group grow? These questions are very closely related and have been asked in almost every organization. In fact, the answer to both questions is the same; **EFFECTIVE RECRUITMENT!** Most groups which grow use various methods to entice people to join them. Square dancing is no different from most other groups when it comes to recruitment.

One major difference with square dancing is that we grow primarily through personal contact. We invite friends, family, and acquaintances to join us in our hobby, hoping they will also enjoy it. Even so, other methods of recruitment are used effectively in square dancing. These methods include: flyers, newspa-

pers, TV, Radio, and demonstrations. Sometimes these methods are successful and sometimes they are not. If one particular method does not work one season, this does not mean it will not work the next.

I'm not sure why square dancing relies so heavily on personal contact, perhaps it is the personal nature of the activity; but the fact is - we do! For this reason, it is very important for each of us to bring others to our classes. If we concentrate on bringing just one person to our next class, and each of us does, our membership would double. Just think of that.

New classes will be starting in September and this is a good time to be talking with friends, neighbors, and co-workers about the benefits of square dancing and trying to get them interested in coming to an 'open house' night at your club next fall. We can explain that they don't have to commit to a full set of lessons. One approach is to ask them to come to just a couple of the open house nights to see what square dancing is like. Once they are at the open house, it will be up to each of us, the caller and club members, to show them how much fun this activity can be and to encourage them to join the class. It is also a **VERY GOOD IDEA** to offer to pick them up and bring them to the open house! Many people have different ideas about our activity and some of these ideas keep people from attending. If we can get them to an open house, we may be able to show that some of their preconceived ideas may not be accurate.

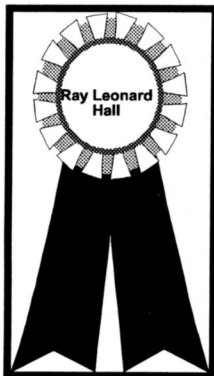

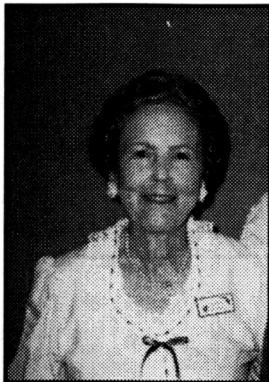

macy, the pharmacist stated that he tried to warn the prescribing doctor about the reaction and was "read the riot act for interfering." Our member stopped the medication and got well. Had he continued, he might not be with us today. Just be careful. Use common sense. Question everything. Lives are saved by doctors and drugs, but let's be careful and conservative.

There are many cases where if one had chosen the "natural route" better health would have been the end result. We should only use drugs or have an operation as a stop gap measure until we get our bodies well with the natural things God has provided us. A better, more healthful life style would not only result in our bodies being healthy but give us a longer, more active life.

With the increased use of pesticides and the increase of imports from countries where pesticides are still in use (banned in the US), we are exposing ourselves to more and more poisons. Make sure you wash all fruits and vegetables before storing them or eating them. Do not rely on someone else doing this for you. You must take charge of your own health.

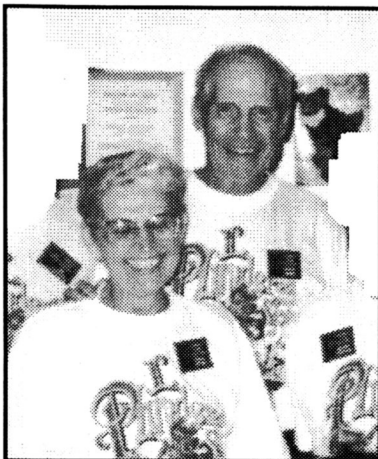

COMPUTERS

Last month I promised that I would tell you how WINDOWS 98 installation went. Well I will say – it went!

I would NOT recommend you do an upgrade unless you have a plain vanilla computer of at least a Pentium power or equivalent with at least 16 meg memory.

I installed WINDOWS 98 on a 233 Mhz Pentium II and a 200 Mhz notebook. It looked like all went great – except things did not work as before! I have a parallel port Imation 120 Mbytes 3 1/2 floppy system I use to move data from one system to another and also to place all data on to save the 1.6 Gig hard drive on the notebook.

Let's look at what went right.

I did not make a backup as I was resigned to formatting my hard drive and starting over if things went wrong. Now I realize most of you would not want to do that so I really advise all to make a backup of anything you would not want to lose. I also would advise you to round up all your drivers (video card, CD drive, and sound card) to have ready if things go wrong. You must also have the "boot" disk that came with your computer. If you don't have these things then go to windows and make a "boot" disk BEFORE you start the upgrade. If you don't do these things then be ready to pay for someone to get your system running again – without all the data you have stored on your hard drive.

The system accepted the upgrade and booted correctly the first time! I also upgraded to the FAT 32 for my hard drive. I regained over 800 Mbyte of data storage from my 6.4 Gig HD and I know I will continue to gain the same ratio as I continue to use the hard drive for storage. This is net savings after installing WINDOWS 98! To me this made the upgrade worthwhile. ALL Microsoft software I use worked fine. It also loaded and ran much faster. Nothing but a plus here. All my files were in tack. Felt all was well.

Now let's look at where I had problems.

I then tried to run my ZIP program. I down load lots of stuff from the internet and must have a good ZIP – UNZIP program. The first time I tried to run this software I got the message – need a FAT 32 zip program! Well, I bought one from the internet – WINZIP and it works better than my old software. At a price of \$29.00 I felt that was OK. Had not PLANNED on spending the \$29. Then I tried to use my Imation external drive. WRONG. Spent time on the internet and found that I had to get a new driver to work

Just think, if we each brought just one other person to the open house AND only one-third of these new people joined the class and club, our membership would double in only three years!

with WINDOWS 98 system. No problem – did the download and the system works again.

The next package I had trouble with was one of my games. I like the Command and Conquer action games. Well, I loaded it and found that I had no sound! I needed to load the drivers again for that. Now you see why I said to have the drivers handy when you start your upgrade. The same with the monitor and video drivers. The games need to know what you have. You had better have the drivers!

The system I have makes use of the flat bed scanner to do OCR (Optical Character Recognition). I get lots of type written documents and really don't like to retype them. The OCR worked – but totally different from the way it used to do. Again, if you don't have LOTS of experience you had better know someone who does or really know how to get information from the internet. I was able to work around this "new" way of using the hardware and all is OK.

I would conclude by saying that the notebook with only 16 meg of memory was the most troublesome of the three computers I have upgraded to Windows 98. Would I do it again? Yes! This BARN OWL was done AFTER upgrading to Windows 98. Is it more reliable (Windows 98)? I would say no at the present time. I have just as many crashes as I did before. The added speed and savings in hard drive storage space makes it worth while. Should you do it? I think that depends on how many peripherals you have, the knowledge you have and how handy all your drivers are, as well as you familiarity with the WEB.

Some of your older software will not run on the new system. I have an old CD that has some casino games on it. It will not run on the notebook. Of course the new CD's are much better and the cost of such software is minimal. If you notice, the main problems were with games. On the positive side, FreeCell and Solitaire both ran perfectly. I know a lot of you are now as hooked on FreeCell as I am.

The new IE 4.0 interface makes MY COMPUTER load and execute a lot slower. This is primarily due to the extra information that is loaded automatically. As you normally do not need this information, you lose speed without gaining anything worthwhile. I would remove IE 4.0 in a second if you could. I did remove all the IE 4.0 desktop "junk" and the extra IE 4.0 from the system that I could safely do.

If you decide to upgrade, please read and heed all the warning you receive from the system as you proceed. All new computers will come preloaded with Windows 98 now. May as well get on board.

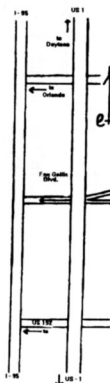

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

Last month we discussed the symbols for the 12 tribes of Israel. I am sure it was not the most exciting reading you have ever done. It is exciting when we tell the REST OF THE STORY.

Each of the 12 tribes were divided into camps. On the NORTH side were 3 tribes and the head of that camp was DAN. On the SOUTH side were 3 tribes and the head of that camp was Rueben. On the EAST side were 3 tribes and the head of that camp was Judah and on the WEST side were 3 tribes and the head of that camp was Ephraim. These camps made up the twelve tribes of Israel.

In the NEW TESTAMENT we have the four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. These Gospels show Christ as the Judge, the SON of Man, GOD and the Bread of Life. The Gospel (THE KINGDOM OF GOD) gives us the ministry of Christ. There was no beginning and there is no end. Christ was, is and is forever more. The number 4 in the Bible always means related to earth.

On the WEST side was the camp of Ephraim. The Strong's Exhaustive number for Ephraim is 6509 and means "bear fruit", Bread of life" and "bring forth". Matthew shows Christ as the Bread of Life. Matthew gives the genealogy of Christ and gives his birth place as Bethlehem. Bethlehem means "Bread of Life". Matthew starts by tracing the genealogy of Christ back to Abraham. This was the start of the worlds great religions. Thus, Christ is the Bread of Life of all the worlds religions.

On the North Side was the camp of Dan. Dan means "judge". A judge is defined in the dictionary as someone that is able to judge the worth of anything, a person who can decide right from wrong. The Book of Mark shows Christ as Wonderful, a person with super human powers, a person with power and able to do miracles. He is also the "wise" one.

On the South side was the camp of Rueben. The name Rueben means "son". The Book of Luke clearly shows Christ as the Son of God. Luke 1:32 "he shall be great, and He shall be called the Son of the Highest". The symbol of Rueben is water. Christ is described as the "Water of Life" throughout the Bible.

On the East side was the camp of Judah. Judah means Power and God. The symbol of Judah is the lion, King. It was on the East side and we know God returns to the earth from the East. The Book of John clearly shows Christ as God. The Book of John starts out with "In the beginnings

was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginnings with God. All things were made by Him; and without Him was not anything made that was made". Could this describe any other than God?

Why do we need to know these things? I am sure that we all have "changed" our beliefs somewhat over the years. Most of what we believe we believe because of circumstances. We were born a certain religion. We were raised a certain religion. We married and maybe changed to our spouse's religion.

Every religion in the world is the Bible plus or minus something. Some religions have extra books. Some religions have decided to remove some books. Every religion in the world has much in common. Even religions that do not have the Bible have the truth given to them. If we study the Bible, if we can understand that not all think and believe as we do, we can honestly appreciate their religion. I am very happy that not all believe the same. The world government tried to foster this "one world religion" on humanity in the past. It is the cause of much strife and hate. It causes wars. We can understand one another if we understand the Bible and accept it as our guide. What you believe out of the Bible is exactly what God wants you to believe. We do not all understand the same thing. We should accept this and get along with one another. Is it important if some believe that you have to be baptized a certain way? The Apostle Paul stated he was happy that he didn't go around baptizing. It caused problems then and it causes problems now. Others believe there is a "magic" prayer that needs to be said to "get you to heaven". It is not in the Bible. There are those who preach Hell as a place to flee from rather than teach the soon coming of Christ to rule the world in truth and grace.

I believe in the Bible. I believe that God is in charge. I have not been given the job of changing what you believe. I will continue to write these articles, not to change your beliefs, but to get you to study these things yourself. They are important to you and I respect the good your religion has done. I know that if we become so convinced that we think our way is THE WAY, we begin to want to change the way people believe. We may feel it is our "calling" to make certain that all believe as we do. That, my friends, is not in the Bible. We have a Judge that will soon take complete charge of this world.
