

FROM THE BARN HITCHEN

STRAWBERRY PIE

Need one baked pie shell

2/3 cup sugar

1 cup water

2 TBL. Cornstarch

2 TBL. Strawberry jello

Mix cornstarch and sugar, add water. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly for 30 seconds, or until clear.

Remove from heat and add jello and stir until dissolved. Slice berries in pie shell. Pour above mixture over berries.

Chill for 3 hours and serve with whipped cream.

You may use one cup sugar or less, depending on the berries and your taste. Use generous tablespoon measurements (not heaping).

MARKETING SQUARE DANCING

(You Can't Win If You Don't Know Why You Are losing) September 2000

During the recent CALLERLAB convention in Las Vegas the excitement was running high and the enthusiasm for a new plan to market square dancing could be felt everywhere. The Foundation For The Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing had approved the plan, known as "The Phoenix Plan (A New Beginning)". The Phoenix Plan is a long term three phase plan with an ultimate goal of increasing the number of people involved with square dancing.

Most of us in the square and round dance activity have been concerned for some time about a decease in the number of participants. This decease has been noted at festivals, conventions, week-end events, club dances and other square & round dance events. Several clubs in many areas have stopped dancing. The number of new dancers has also decreased in many areas around the country. All of these factors have been reconjized and action has been initiated to overcome them.

The first step in fixing any problem is to recognize there is a problem.

During the past couple of years there have been many discussions among dance leaders and organizations. These discussions have brought a realization of the problem of our declining numbers to the leaders of the activity. A major part of The Phoenix Plan is to increase the awareness of the problem and to increase awareness among all organizations and individuals involved with the activity.

Approval of The Phoenix Plan by The Foundation Board Of Directors is the first step toward implementation of a plan to bring all the organizations involved with square dancing together to work toward a common goal. That goal is to increase the number of participants in square and round dancing. During Phase One of the plan, market research will be conducted to begin gathering information which will be used during other phases of the plan. This market research will be conducted and analyzed by market research professionals. Another aspect of Phase One is fund raising efforts to provide money to cover the costs of the professional market research. Tax deductible donations may be made to The Foundation to help with the implementation of The Phoenix Plan.

An interesting book called "Bowling Alone" by Professor Robert D. Putnam provides some very interesting information about and depth research of the general decline of social activities during the past few decades. This decline has been evident in all social groups and we have seen it first hand in square dancing. Jim Mayo, member of the CALLERLAB Executive Committee, has written a very interesting "book report" on this book. Next month we will provide that report.
