Before this exciting event, we have several months of fun-filled dancing planned. Our November themes are as follows:
















Community Outreach



Robert Arden "Bobby" Keefe, born 12-8-39 and Born Again in January 1990, passed from this world into the arms of his Heavenly Father on Sunday, October 13, 2024. Born in Jacksonville, FL to Howard and Lucile Keefe. Even though the Depression and WWII were imminent, Bobby had a blessed childhood. He attended local schools and graduated from Paxon High School in 1957. He served in the Air Force and Army National Guard for several years, having completed training in electronics. After returning home, he worked for Edgewood TV for a period of time and then went to work for Jacksonville Electric Authority until his retirement as Supervisor of Maintenance, after 27 years employment. Other endeavors following retirement from JEA included working for Atlantic Beach Auto Parts and owning his own automotive machine shop.

He also worked for Dupont Mining for 5 years as Training Specialist and Site Supervisor for contract personnel.

His primary non-work interest, however, was teaching and calling Western-style square dancing, starting in 1960 and ending with his retirement in early 2024.

In January 1990, Bobby felt the call on his life for Christian service and returned to college to obtain a music degree. He served as Minister of Music at Fellowship Baptist Church in Raiford, FL since April 2006.

Preceded in death by his father, mother, sister, brother and brother-in-law, he has stated that his life has been the greatest journey one could ever ask for.

Bobby is survived by his loving wife and partner of 40 years, June, son Robert Jr. (Kara) of Rossville, GA and daughter Kendra (Ken) Phelps of Sardis, MS. Six grandchildren, Travis (Meghin Cone) Keefe, Ryan (Mackinley) Keefe, Darian Keefe, Kourtney (Landon Nye) Brown, Katlan Howell and Brandon (Katie) Phelps and seven greatgrandchildren. The funeral service was held at his church in Raiford on Saturday, October 19, 2024. Interment was at Riverside Memorial Park, 7242 Normandy Boulevard, Jacksonville, following the funeral. Bobby was a great square dance caller. From the most basic level through the challenge level he had an ability to read the floor, make the difficulty doable, and all with

a smile on his face. Bobby was encouraging in my early years of calling by insisting that clear explanations of each call were essential. In years past, Bobby and June were always an encouragement to Sandra and me and to the Northeast Callers Association. Jim Duncan

When I was asked to write a few lines about Bobby, I was introduced to impossible. Bobby was another of my many mentors and I will miss him. Bobby took a couple of years off from calling, and then came back as the kinder, gentler Bobby. He still expected you to know how to do the moves, but didn't fuss quite as loud if you made a mistake. Bobby attended quite a few of my dances and made me a better caller. He did not mind offering "advice" to callers. Hand usage, body flow, timing, whatever he could do to help you, he was there. RIP Bobby. (more on some of this later).

Peggy and I had just moved to Gainesville in 1974 or 75. I had been calling in the Panama Canal Zone and up in Memphis. The next caller was Bobby Keefe, and Bobby assured us we would be able to dance to him. We got up to dance. Well, Bobby was an "all position" caller and very good at what he did. When he started calling, Peggy and I had trouble understanding exactly what he wanted us to do. It was Mainstream, but he called from such different positions it was quite challenging! We were struggling to keep up, and Bobby kept calling us out by name to try and get us into the correction positions. He was calling stuff like "Check your Phantom Diamonds, Diamond Circulate and Spread..." Peggy and I were embarrassed. After that dance we watched the other callers and realized it was just Bobby Keefe who was so challenging. At the end of this tip, I went up to Bobby and told him I would never believe him again when he said we could dance to him. I still think he did that on purpose. We were embarrassed and pretty upset with Bobby for misleading us at the time, but Peggy and I eventually took classes from Bobby and were finally able to dance to him. We became good friends, but I never let him forget that time he lied to us!!

Peggy and I just loved Bobby and became good friends with him and his wife. We enjoyed dancing with him at the Quarter Mores in Jacksonville. What a great caller!

Don & Donna would dance up and down the center aisle of their barn with Ivan playing a taped son and Ann teaching them the steps. She was still learning the steps herself at the time! That's how it all got started. Don & Donna did learn to dance, and they all joined the Dixie Dancers. After that they joined the Square Wheels Square Dance Camping Club. Ann became their cuer and Ivan was affectionately referred to as her "roadie". After he got her equipment set up to cue, you could usually find him selling 50-50 tickets. Even when it became hard for him to dance, he loved visiting with everyone. A year or so ago they joined the High Springs Dance Club where she cues, and he continued to be her "roadie". Many thanks to all the callers and cuers who helped along the way.




